## *An Inconvenient Ride and The Global to Local Celebration*

*“It is generally recognized that over the coming decades, the global environment is going to be at the forefront of economics, government and education. To make a significant change in our environmental practices, we must inspire our youth to become proactive facilitators of necessary change.” Al Gore*

### **Overview –**

To raise awareness of local programs in our community that are making a tangible difference in the environment, we are proud to present ***An Inconvenient Ride*** and ***Global to Local***. These two interconnected events serve to highlight and support the programs of Mayor Nickels **Climate Action Now**, **The Green Seattle Partnership** and **Project Earth Care**.

***An Inconvenient Ride*** involves eight students from Sealth High and Gatewood Elementary School’s, who will receive a ceremonial tree in Washington DC and begin a 5,400 mile bicycle ride through cities that have signed on to Seattle Mayor, Greg Nickels, climate protection program. Departing Washington DC on March 31, 2008, the students will collect over 10,000 signatures from Governors, Mayors and students in a show of support, and commitment, to protecting the environment. Ceremonial tree plantings will be conducted in selected cities along the route.

The students will arrive back in Seattle on April 22 (Earthday) to kick off the ***Global to Local*** benefit at the beautiful S. Mark Taper Auditorium at Benaroya Hall, featuring world famous photographer Art Wolfe among other guest luminaries. A portion of every ticket sold will go to purchase 2,500 native trees which will then be planted in Seattle greenbelts and parks by students from Seattle Public Schools.

### **Event Components –**

- Ceremonial tree presentation in Washington DC
- 5,400 mile Cross Country Bicycle Ride
- Climate Action Now Summit Meetings
- National signature campaign.
- Global to Local event at Benaroya Hall

***Kickoff Event –***

The kick off to *An Inconvenient Ride* will include the presentation of a ceremonial tree to the students in Washington DC. This symbolic icon will then be transported across country with the students.

***Cross Country Bicycle Trip***

Upon leaving Washington DC, students will embark on a 5,400 mile bicycle ride through cities that have committed to Mayor Nickels *Climate Action Now* program. The riding of bicycles symbolizes not only alternative transportation, but a sense of commitment to the environment as well.

***Climate Action Now Summits***

Students will meet with Local Government and School officials in each of the participating Cities to share information on what Seattle is doing to reduce our carbon footprint, and how curriculum's have been created so students can get actively involved on environmental projects.

***National Signature Campaign***

Students will collect 10,000 signatures from Governors, Mayors and students along the route in a show of support, and commitment, to protecting the environment. The signatures will be collected on a large, artistic banner that will be created by local artists.

***Global To Local***

Global to Local is the culminating event on April 22, at Benaroya Hall. Featuring Mayor Greg Nickels, world renown nature photographer Art Wolfe, celebrities and dignitary's, Global to Local will be an evening to celebrate the environment. From displays, live performances and a special audio visual presentation by Art Wolfe, Global to Local will be a memorable event for the entire family. A portion of every ticket sold will go to purchase 2,500 native trees which will then be planted in Seattle greenbelts and parks by students from Seattle Public Schools.

Proceeds from the event go to ***Project Earth Care***, a student environmental organization, and will be used to fund various environmental projects in the Seattle / King County area.



# *Project Earth Care*

## *Educational / Community Benefits*

***Project Earth Care*** was created at Sealth High School to form an intergenerational partnership between K-12 schools, local government and neighborhoods, for the purpose of identifying, and actively working on, environmental projects that will benefit the entire community, while providing a hands on learning opportunity for students at all age levels. Featuring a unique partnership with Gatewood Elementary and Denny Middle schools, the project has fostered mentoring opportunities, shared curricula and staff collaboration to create a series of remarkable educational outcomes.

***Project Earth Care*** offers a unique vertical alignment opportunity for grade, middle and high schools, with students at all levels directly involved in the project. In the process, intergenerational learning groups are formed that foster both student and adult mentoring opportunities and create cooperative learning environments.

Beginning with the Pelly Place Ravine pilot project in West Seattle, this unique template can be replicated in other parts of Seattle, throughout the United States and internationally, as we strive to get youth actively involved in the growing number of environmental issues facing our world.

Specifically ***Project Earth Care***:

1. Provides a relevant, multi level, educational project for students of all ages.
2. Provides a unique vehicle for both the schools and community to explore and discuss environmental issues in their neighborhood and then work collectively on a positive outcome.
3. Provides unique, hands on, teaching opportunities for addressing the achievement gap.
4. Allows High School students to work with, and mentor, students in Elementary and Middle schools on important environmental projects.



# *Project Earth Care*

## *Partnerships*

***Project Earth Care*** is a pro active partner with ***Green Seattle Partnership*** and Mayor Nickels ***Climate Action Now*** initiative. By utilizing the city wide enrollment and unique diversity found in Seattle Public Schools, ***Project Earth Care*** can be a driving force to help accomplish the important environmental goals of these two programs.

### ***Green Seattle Partnership***

The Green Seattle Partnership is a unique public/private partnership between the City of Seattle and the [Cascade Land Conservancy](#) to restore all of the forested parklands of Seattle. It is a vision of a city with diverse, invasive-free, sustainable forests. It's goal is to restore 2,500 acres of forested parkland in the City of Seattle by the year 2025 and to increase volunteer participation to approximately 100,000 hours a year by 2010.

### ***Climate Action Now***

The City of Seattle's Climate Protection Initiative was born in February 2005 when Mayor Nickels pledged that Seattle—the entire community not just City government—would meet or beat the United States' target of the Kyoto Treaty: reducing greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions to 7 percent below 1990 levels by 2012.

Seattle Climate Action Now is an exciting effort to give everyone in Seattle the tools needed to start making a real difference at home, at work, and on the road. It will bring you together with people across the street and across town to take action to protect the climate for all of us and for future generations.

**Seattle** – Sixty five cities across the country have signed on to participate in *An Inconvenient Ride*, a major national event to promote environmental awareness. Created and produced by students from Chief Sealth High School, *An Inconvenient Ride* is part of Project Earth Care, a pioneering and collaborative effort involving **Sealth** and **Gatewood Elementary** students who have joined together to launch an innovative environmental program in their community.
